HHA PET POLICY / PET CONSENT AGREEMENT & ASSISTANCE ANIMAL POLICY:

The Housing Authority recently updated the Pet Policy and Pet Consent Agreement. A new policy was also adopted by the board for assistance animals. The policies replaced all previous rules regarding pets and addressed HUD regulations concerning assistance animals in public housing.

If you have not done so, please stop by the office to sign the new agreement and policy. Notices will go out the first week in April for any unsigned agreements and policies.

REAC Inspection – What you need to know:

A REAC Inspector is scheduled to inspect all public housing units this May. The inspection will only affect tenants living in Sunflower Heights & Meadowlark apartments. The inspection is scheduled for May 4th.

The following is what to expect during the inspection:

 Outside Each Unit - The inspector will walk around each building looking for hazards, overgrown vegetation, and overall building maintenance (foundation, roof, gutters, windows & doors) - Please have trash & animal waste disposed of properly & belongings on patio

The Director & possibly maintenance will accompany the Inspector inside each unit. We will ring doorbells, knock, and if no answer will enter the unit. The following items will be checked inside each unit:

- All doors (entrance, bedroom, bathroom, & closet) must be able to close and latch properly
- Windows & Doors must be accessible and cannot be blocked
- Bathrooms we will look at pipes below sink (water must be on and running)
- Stoves all burners on stoves will be turned on including inside oven (oven must be empty)
- Refrigerators seals will be checked on doors (doors will be opened)

The inspector will look for signs of unsanitary conditions such as air quality of the apartment, trash disposed properly, grime and grease build up, etc.

Sunflower Heights: Mowing, Curb Appeal, and Spring Cleaning...

Mowing at Sunflower Heights: Once again mowing season will begin for the housing authority. We need your assistance with the following items during mowing season:

- Pick up toys, garden supplies, belongings, etc. place on your patios & off the grass
- Tenants with dogs: please remove dog waste promptly
- Please pick up your cigarette butts around apartments (be mindful of children & always put butts in a can or similar container by your door & dispose of regularly).
- If you see trash on the lawn Pick it up

Curb Appeal at Sunflower Heights: *Please keep patios clean – unsightly patios* & *lawns give a bad impression of the housing authority.* In order to help with curb appeal, we are going to have a trash receptacle placed by the play area, please dispose of litter, broken toys, etc. You can make a big difference by helping a little.

Spring Cleaning at Sunflower Heights: The Housing Authority will provide a large dumpster which will be placed on the far south side of Sunflower apartments. The dumpster will stay there for a few weeks in order for tenants to dispose of unwanted furniture, etc.

Nutritional Facts

1 serving (1/2 cup) equals 164 calories, 5 g fat (1 g saturated fat), 0 cholesterol, 530 mg sodium, 31 g carbohydrate, 2 g fiber, 1 g protein.

Ingredients:

• 1 lb. Canned Kraut (drained)

1 cup Onion (chopped)1 c. Celery (chopped)

½ c. Green Bell Pepper (chopped)
1/3 c. Diced Pimentos (drained)

• 1 c. Sugar

Directions:

Mix first 5 ingredients together. Pour sugar over mix. Cover & refrigerate for 24 hours. Stir & mix well before serving.

Director's Note:

When Mike asked me to try her sauerkraut salad, I cringed because I hate sauerkraut. I didn't want to taste it but she managed to convince me & said I wouldn't regret it. She made a believer out of me for sure! The salad tastes nothing like kraut, in fact I wanted more and cleaned my bowl quickly. Give it a try – it's a little like coleslaw and would be a good picnic recipe! Enjoy!
